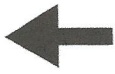

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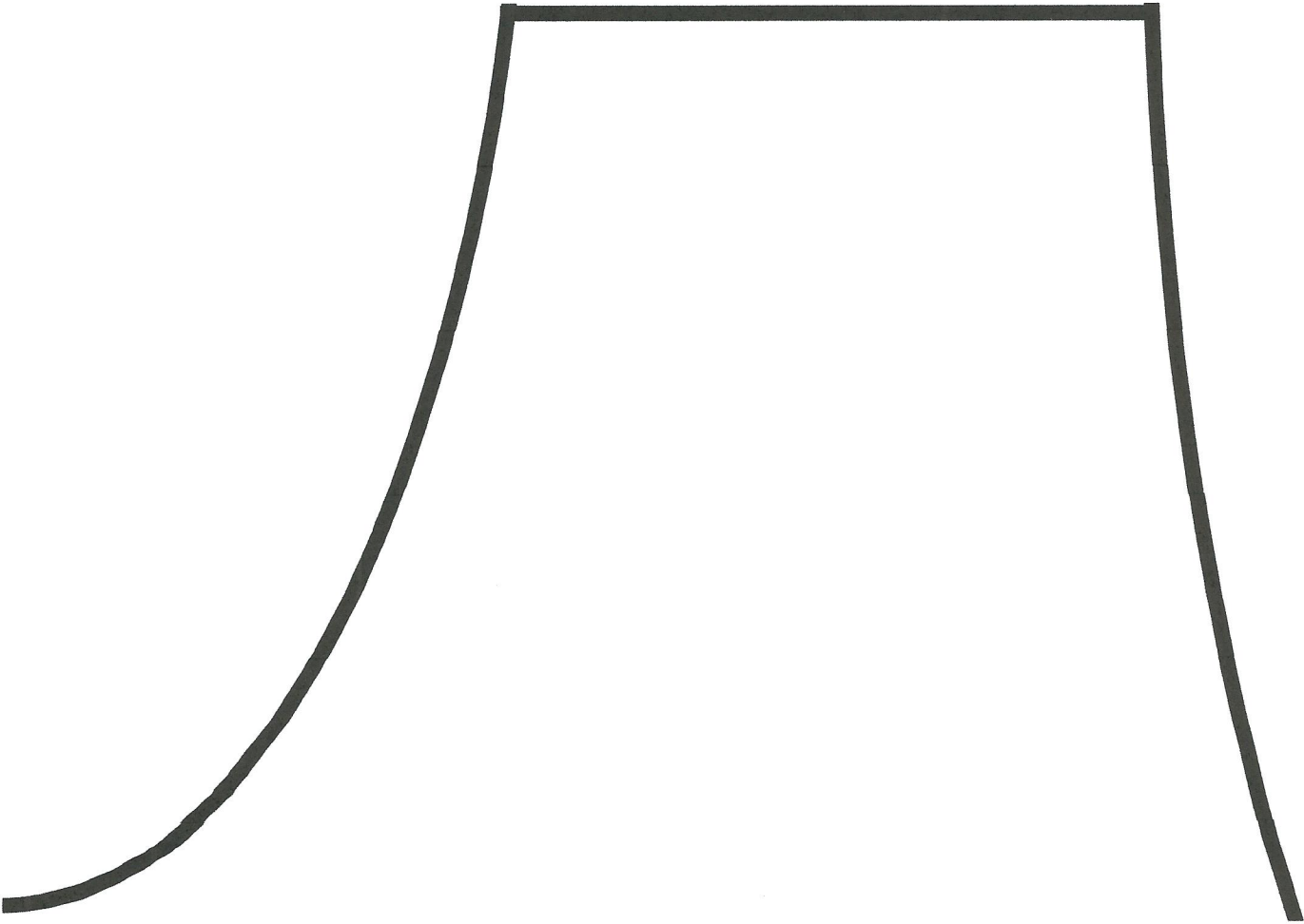


Kiku Knot Bag Instructions

(Japanese Knot Bag)

- 1) Cut 2 pieces of fabric to 20X40 inches. Fold each in half long way.
Place the pattern on the fold and cut pattern.
- 2) Unfold each piece and iron flat.
- 3) Lay the right sides of the pieces together and pin.
- 4) Sew all edges together leaving one shorter handle area unstitched at top.. You will use this opening to turn your bag.
- 5) Turn bag inside out by pulling it through the unstitched handle..
- 6) Iron whole piece nice and flat.
- 7) Fold the unstitched shorter handle area inside itself by 1/2 inch and iron it flat.
- 8) Decide which fabric is to be the outside of bag and fold to match the handles.
- 9) Sew up both sides stopping where marked by arrows. Place pin or make pencil mark to mark the arrows (stopping points) on fabric.
- 10) Sew the top of the larger handles together. Sew the top of the shorter handles together.
- 11) Turn right side out and iron again..
- 12) To carry, slide the taller handle through the shorter handle and slip on to
